Professor Itamar Rabinovich of Tel Aviv University, Israel's leading expert on Lebanon, visited Los Angeles recently to address the Brandeis-Bardin Forum on Contemporary Values. At the initiation of Jack Salzberg, Brandeis-Ba. Im Institute President, Prof Rabinovich participated in a panel discussion on "Israel After Lebanon," and addressed a group of nearly 1200. Leading the discussion as part of the panel were Dennis Prager, Instituté Director, and Joseph Telushkin, Education Director.

'Head of the University's Shiloah Center for Middle Eastern and African Studies, Prof. Rabinovich also met with leading members of the business community and political editors to brief them on the current situation in the Middle East.

Nearly 100 supporters of Tel Aviv University were invited to a reception in his honor hosted by Isaac and Carolyn Starkman in their home, to learn of recent developments in the relationship between the United States and Israel. "The Reagan Administration can no longer look at the problem in Lebanon as just a problem between Israelis and Arabs," he stressed, "but it has to look at it as something that is beginning to influence the relations between the U.S. and the Soviet Union.

Prof. Rabinovich also noted that time is running out before the beginning of the 1984 reelection campaign gets underway in this country, and that something must be done soon to aid the settlement process in the area. "There are only a few months left for Washington to maneu-ver effectively in the Middle East," he em-

The Los Angeles Herald Examiner hosted a breakfast for Prof. Rabinovich to meet with top business leaders of Southern California. Also participating in the meeting were Benyamin Navon, Consul General of Israel; Osias Goren, Jewish Federation Council President; and Federation Executive Vice President, Ted Kanner.

Prof. Rasinovich, author of The War For Lebanon 1970 = 1982, also met with political editors of the Los Angeles Times to address the current political climate in the Middle East.

"The Aran - Israeli settlement process is irreversible," stated Prof. Rabinovich, "There may be crises, setbacks, even possibly more Arib - Israeli wars. But we do have an Arab-Israeli settlement process, not a smooth one, but still a peace process."

## ISRAEL OPERA COMPANY NAMES DIRECTOR

NEW-YORK, N.Y. -- Sarah Caldwell, the founder and artistic director of the Opera Company of Boston, has been named artistic director of the newly formed Opera Company of Israel. In a joint announcement by Mayor Shlomo Lahat of Tel Aviv and Efraim Margolin, President of the American Israel Opera Foundation, 275 Madison Avenue, New York, N.Y. 10016. it was disclosed that Miss Caldwell will inaugurate the new company with two productions in Israel this fall featuring casts of international

Mr. Margolin and his wife, Florence, were instrumental in concluding the agreement, which calls for Miss Caldwell to oversee the formation of the new Israeli company to perform at the Mann Auditorium in Tel Aviv.

Mr. Margolin said the American Israel Opera Foundation will raise additional funds in the United States for the new venture. He added that the company, to be headed by Miss Caldwell, is meant to fill the void created by the closing of the previous Opera Company of Israel

Ms. Caldwell said she expects to spend about two months a year in Israel at a time which will not conflict with her responsibilities in Boston. Ms. Caldwell was first made aware of the potential for a new opera company in Israel by Mr. Margolin who accompanied her on a tour of that country last November.

Mayor Lahar said that in addition to Israeli Government and Tel Aviv municipal backing, the new company enjoys the enthusiastic support of the Israel Philharmonic and its music director, Zubin Mehta. Mayor Lahat stated that Mr. Mehata and Ms. Caldwell will collaborate in the new operatic endeavor in the near future.
