B'NAI B'RITH URGED TO BECOME ADVOCATE FOR ELDERLY POOR

WASHINGTON - Dr.
Arthur Flemming,
former secretary of
Health, Education and
Welfare, has called
on B'nai B'rith to
become an advocate
on behalf of the nation's elderly poor.

"Millions of America's elderly have been cut off from life," he told a meeting here of the Jewish service organization's three program commissions.

Flemming was honored by B'nai B'rith's Community Volunteer Services Commission for "outstanding contributions in community service, citizenship and humanitarianism," He was presented with B'nai B'rith's Chai (life) Award,

The former Cabinet officer. who is currently chairman of the National Council on Aging, director of the National Coalition for Quality Inte-grated Education and former chairman of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights, saidthat churches and syna-gogues "have not reached out" to the of isolated millions elderly.

"These people need an advocate, they need someone to build and maintain bridges," he declared.

Flemming noted that B'nai B'rith had several programs that included the elderly and praised CVS for directing thousands of member - volunteers to reach out to them and other groups needing help. The Community Volunteer Services Commission has been helping America in a very significant way to tap this resource (volunteers)", he said. Flemming recognized that B'nai B'rith places emphasis on delivery of programs as well as advocacy of social policies and described them as equally important.

Stating that he looks forward to working with B'nai B'rith on behalf of the poor and the elderly, Flemming said that he is "confident B'nai B'rith will continue to respond to the chal-

lenge" of helping those in need.

In presenting the Chai Award to the former HEW chief, CVS Commission Chairman Leon Rosenfield of Los Angeles noted that Flemming's entire adult life -- he is now 78 years old -- has been dedicated to helping others.

"Not only has he served every president from Franklin Roosevelt to Ronald Reagan, but he has, at

the same time, been a committed activist in many professional and volunteer agencies that assist the disadvantaged," Rosenfield said.

The Chai Award has been presented since 1974 when the late Supreme Court Justice Tom C. Clark was named its first recipient.
