

At the time, he had scraped together \$1,200 to produce a fastpaced musi-comedy farce reminiscent of the zany "Hellzapoppin" revues of the '30's and '40's, made famous by the comedy team of Olsen & Johnson.

"It's funny to look back," he said recently, and think that we were being paid \$900 a week for the whole show. The dancers got \$70 a week and the principals were paid \$85. I was pocketing \$120 a week which," he laughed, "is still my salary."
