## BEGIN GOVERNMENT DEFENDS POLICIES IN LEBANON

### ISRAELI OFFICIAL URGES FREE WORLD TO GET SYRIAN ARMY OUT OF LEBANON

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Israel's Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs, Yehuda Ben-Meir called on "the entire free world" to use its influence on Syria "to end its occupation in Lebanon."

"Syria should understand that it would be completely isolated by the international community if it continues its occupation of Lebanon," Ben-Meir declared in a press conference held at the Israeli Consulate. He charged that Syria has been so far "doing all in its power to undermine the agree-

ment" on troops withdrawal between Israel and Lebanon reached through the mediation of Secretary of State George Schultz.

Ben-Meir, who began an eight-day visit to the U.S. during which he will meet with Administration officials in Washington, said that "The Syrians know that Israel has no intention of engaging in hostilities with Syria. They know it. The Russians know it. It is clear that the Syrians want to continue to occupy Lebanon and do not want

This came about while the Israeli Defense Force was sustaining almost daily casualties from ambushes and hit and run attacks by Syrian protected Palestinian terrorists in Lebanon.

Begin, speaking in reply to an agenda motion by Labor Alignment MK Michael Bar-Zohar,

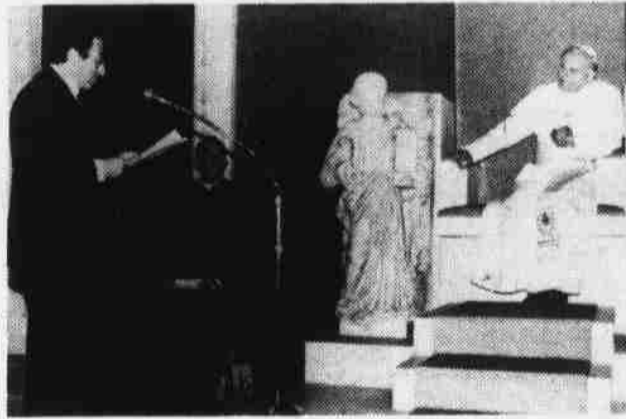

### RABBI MEETS WITH POPE



"NEVER AGAIN will the Jewish people be victims of another Final Solution, for G-d has bestowed upon us the gift of the State of Israel -- a country determined to stand up for the dignity of Jews the world over." So said Rabbi Marvin Hier (pictured above), founder and Dean of the Los Angeles-based Simon Wiesenthal Center, who recently led a 30-person delegation which met with Pope John Paul II in the Vatican. The delegation, from the U.S., Canada and Mexico, was the first Jewish group to meet with the Pope in 1983. They were received by the pontiff after travelling to Warsaw and Auschwitz - Birkenau on the occasion of the 40th anniversary of the uprising in the Jewish ghetto. The Wiesenthal Center's statement called upon the Pope to denounce current anti-Semitism. In his response the Pope did not speak directly to the issue. He praised the meeting as strengthening the bonds between Catholics and Jews, saying, "May G-d bless you and your families and your nation with harmony and peace." Later, the official text of the message that appeared in L'Observatore Romano the words "...and your nation..." (which referred to Israel) were deleted.
