-- The head of Italy's Jewish community said that new anti-Jewish attitudes stemming from the Middle East conflict now posed greater dangers for European Jewry than older and more familiar forms of anti - Semitism.

Tullia Zevi, president of the Union of Italian Jewish communities, said also that "classic" anti-Semitism was diminishing in Western Europe but, she stressed, "continued vigilance against known neo - Nazi and anti - Semitic forces" was still necessary.
