## D'AMATO PRAISES REAGAN

U.S. Senator Alfonse M. D'Amato (R-C-NY) praised President Reagan for making the "right decision" in ordering the release of F-16 fighter planes promised to Israel.

"The President's action will enable Israel to continue to pursue peace from a position of strength, and will signal the nations of the Mideast that the United States stands by our ally in this tenuous moment of history," said D'Amato who had opposed the delay of the F-16 ship-

D'Amato stressed the importance of continued U.S. support for Israel in a letter sent to Reagan. "Especially now, in light of the huge Soviet financed buildup in Syrian armaments, our support is necessary to maintain the delicate military balance in the Mideast, he wrote. "I know you share the conviction that Israel is the strongest ally of our nation in that region, and that its democratic institutions warrant the support and encouragement of our government."

D'Amato said the President's decision came a time when Congressional support for the release of the planes was gaining momentum. A Senate resolution urging the adminstration to honor U.S. commitments to sell the F-16s to Israel had been introduced by Senator D'Amato and had already garnered the support of 32 other Senators, including nine members of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.
