

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A demonstration against former Chief of Staff Gen. Rafael Eitan erupted into a near riot at the Hebrew University when pro- and anti-Eitan students battled each other in a meeting hall where Eitan had just mounted the podium to speak. University security guards, unable to break up the melee, summoned police who dragged some of the demonstrators outside and arrested two, one Jewish student and one Arab student. Eitan, in his address to some 400 students, criticized Jews who supported "the other side" in the struggle for the "Land of Israel." He warned: "If the other side wins, nothing will be left of us."

BONN (WNS) -- The leadership body of the United Protestant Lutheran Church of Germany, the VELKD, issued a strong indictment of anti-Semitism at its meeting in Hanover. In appealing to the public to stand up against any form of hatred of enmity toward Jews, the church leadership declared that the struggle against anti-Semitism included making a distinction between criticism of the policies of the Israeli government and the legitimate claim of the Jewish people for their state within secure borders.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Emanuel Rackman, president of the Bar Ilan University, announced here the establishment of a new School of Economics and Business at the University in Israel which will emphasize the teaching of American methods of management and business administration. The groundbreaking took place June 23. Building construction is scheduled to be completed by the end of 1985, Rackman reported.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Raphael Korlowitz, head of the immigration and absorption department of the Jewish Agency, predicted here that by the end of 1983, some 15,000 olim from Western countries will settle in Israel. He disclosed that in the first four months of this year 3,393 olim came to Israel from the West compared with 2,287 during the same period in 1982.

JOHANNESBURG (WNS) -- Eddy Magid, a city councilman for many years, was recently elected Deputy Mayor of Johannesburg. Magid joined Betar, the Revisionist youth movement, when he moved to Johannesburg in 1946. He became one of the first South African Jews to join the battle for the new-born Jewish State, serving in Israel's first tank squadron, which he said consisted of only 20 men and two tanks.

PARIS (WNS) -- The oldest Jewish monument ever found in France is today threatened with decay after its discovery seven years ago. It was during excavation in the courtyard of the law courts of Rouen, the Normandy town where Joan of Arc was burned to death after her trial, that the vestiges of what appeared to be a yeshiva were unearthed. The small building, built around the year 1100 was in the Jewish quarters of Rouen in a street that is still called the street of the Jews today.

GENEVA (WNS) -- The Swiss government and officials at the United Nations were shocked by the announcement that the scheduled Conference on Palestinian rights which was forced to cancel a meeting in Paris in August, reportedly due to French pressure, will take place here in August. The Swiss government has expressed grave reservations regarding security problem for the more than 1,000 delegates who are expected to attend the conference scheduled for August 16 - 24.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The cost of living index rose by 5.5 percent in May, the lowest monthly increase for the past six months, according to figures released by the Central Bureau of Statistics. Only last month, the rise was 6.2 percent. The Finance Ministry expressed satisfaction with the decline. But it was noted by Histadrut Secretary General Yerusham-Meshel that inflation is currently running at an annual rate of about 140 percent.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Jewish Agency Treasurer Akiva Levinsky said here that reforms in the way the United Jewish Appeal allocates funds for special needs in Israel is having a positive effect on the Agency's fiscal situation. He said there were signs that the cumulative deficit is shrinking, and interest payments are smaller. He predicted that the Agency will be able to write off all of its debts within the next five years.

BONN (WNS) -- A court in West Berlin has sentenced a neo-Nazi activist Arnold Priem, to an 18-month prison term. The 35-year-old self proclaimed "fuehrer" of the so-called "Fight Group Priem" was found guilty of illicit arms possession and display of Nazi symbols.
