Syrian President Refused To Budge

JERUSALEM (WNS) - Secretary of State George Shultz's swing through the Middle East, with stop-overs in several Arab capitals and here in Israel, in a renewed U.S. effort to seek an agreement by the Syrians to withdraw their estimated 50,000 troops from Lebanon, concluded on a sour note, without any agreement with Syria nor "any substantive achievement by way of withdrawal" of Syrian troops from Lebanon.

Shultz's stop-over in the Middle East occurred rather unexpectedly as he was returning to


