

**World Council of Churches  
To Convene In Canada**

NEW YORK — Rabbi Marc H. Tanenbaum, national interreligious affairs director of the American Jewish Committee, has been designated one of the two official guests to represent the world Jewish community at the Sixth Assembly of the World Council of Churches to be held in Vancouver, British Columbia, July 24 through August 10.

The International Jewish Committee for Interreligious Consultations (IJCIC), a coalition body of major Jewish organizations from throughout the world, designated Rabbi Tanenbaum, together with Rabbi Jordan Pearlson of Toronto, president of the Canadian Jewish Congress, to represent the Jewish people at the world assembly of Protestant and Orthodox bodies.

Both Jewish religious leaders will present papers at the assembly on the theme of "Judaism and the Life of the World." The WCC has invited the Jewish guests to participate fully in the assembly's deliberations, together

with representatives from Buddhism, Islam, Hinduism, African religions, and other religious and social justice groups.

Both Rabbis Tanenbaum and Pearlson are expected to take part in eight workshop groups dealing with the following themes:

- a) Witnessing a divided world; b) Taking steps toward unity; c) Moving towards participation; d) Healing and sharing life in community; e) Confronting threats to peace and survival; f) Struggling for justice and human dignity; g) Learning in community; and h) Communicating with conviction.

Among the issues that the rabbis will be addressing will be those of Israel-Arab relations and human rights in the Soviet Union and in other parts of the world.

Rabbi Tanenbaum recently attended a liaison committee meeting of the World Council and IJCIC in Geneva, where plans for the Vancouver assembly were discussed.

Dr. Gerhardt Riegner, executive director emeritus of the World Jewish Congress, is chairman of IJCIC.

Founded in 1906, the American Jewish Committee is this country's pioneer human rights organization. It combats bigotry, protects the civil and religious rights of Jews at home and abroad and seeks improved human relations for all people everywhere.

This week Secret Witness is offering up to \$1,000.00 cash reward for information leading to the arrest and indictment of the person or persons who have committed numerous taxi cab armed robberies.

Several armed robberies involving taxi cab drivers, beginning on June 2nd, have been reported to the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department with dates of occurrence being June 9th, 15th, 16th, 18th, 19th, 20th and 21st. Weapons used have been knives or guns.

Possible suspects are two black males described between 25 and 30 years of age, 5'9" to 5'10", 150 pounds to 170. One is clean shaven, the other has a light beard.

After pulling the robberies, the suspects have either been picked up by someone in a car, or they have taken the taxi cab, leaving the driver on foot.

Most of the cab drivers have picked the suspects up on the Las Vegas Strip and have driven them to the downtown area.

Anyone with information pertaining to these robbery suspects are asked to call the Secret Witness hot line, 386-3213. Callers do not have to reveal their identities when giving information or when collecting cash rewards.

Secret Witness will also pay cash rewards on other felony crimes such as information on Cuban Marielitos, involved in criminal activity that were released from the Cuban prison system, entering the U.S. via the Freedom Flotilla.

The Marielitos are extremely dangerous and are dealing heavily in dangerous drugs in the Las Vegas area.

In Las Vegas we have many Marelitos and Cuban people that are outstanding citizens and should not be categorized in any way with the Marielito criminals.

Also this weeks Secret Witness will pay up to \$1,000 cash reward for the arrest of the female shown in this photo.



The suspect is Kelly Jean Hamilton, also known as Kelly Jean Hunt, Michelle Harmon, Kelly Johnson and Kelly Hoot. She is a black female, date of birth, September 4, 1949, 5' 7" tall and 120 pounds.

This suspect is a notorious Hotel and Motel room burglar. She is extremely active as a burglar when out of jail. Her Method of operation is to use either stolen or found room keys to enter the rooms or she will walk through the corridors turning knobs to locate open doors.

Metro Police have outstanding warrants on file for the arrest of Kelly Hanilton.

Anyone having information that will lead to the arrest of this suspect is asked to call the Secret Witness Hot Line, 386-3213.
