Permanent Partition Of Lebanon Feared

JERUSALEM (WNS) - The Cabinet approved a plan for the redeployment of Israeli troops in south Lebanon. The announcement, after a closed session of the Ministerial Defense Committee July 20, contained no specifics but empowered Premier Menachem Begin, Defense Minister Moshe Arens and Foreign Minister Yitzhak Shamir to "determine the details."

The announcement was contained in a short, terse communique. It said: "As proposed by the Prime Minister, the Cabinet has unanimously approved the plan for redeployment of the Israel Defense Force in Lebanon as prepared and submitted by the IDF General Staff." Redeployment to shorten lines in Lebanon was approved in principle by the Cabinet several weeks earlier. But the decision caught U. S. and Lebanese officials by surprise.

The Reagan Administration, which has been generally opposed to the redeployment option, said the decision could "complicate" the already
