

Israel Prepares For Redeployment In Lebanon

Envoy Meets With Senior Israeli Officials

 Robert McFarlane, President Reagan's special envoy to the Middle East, concluded his first round of talks with Israeli leaders. Afmeeting with ter Premier Menachem Begin, and earlier with Foreign Minister Yitzhak Shamir, Mc-Farlane moved on to Beirut with what are said to be "ideas which he heard in Israel.'

McFarlane said his talks were "very useful" because it gave him a "good under-

JERUSALEM (WNS) standing" of the different approaches. between israel and Lebanon. The understanding, he said, "held a promise of progress." The most "urgent priority" was the withdrawal of all foreign troops from Lebanon, McFarlane said.

The envoy is reported to have tried to convince Israeli officials during his two days of talks that the U.S. has no intention of exerting pressure on Israel for a unilateral withdrawal of

Pullout From The Shouf Mountains Imminent

TEL AVIV (WNS) — The Israel Defense Force began preparations for the redeployment of its troops in Lebanon. This was indicated from reports from Beirut which described the frequent movement of long convoys of heavy trucks carrying prefabricated huts and other equipment from the Shouf Mountain area to the coast near Damour south of Beirut and then south along the costal road towards the Awali River where Israeli troops are expected to move.

The IDF explained the movement as 'merely routine (the) withdrawal of winter equipment no longer needed" in the Shouf area. But Israeli military correspondents touring the Awali River line reported massive earth works in progress, with heavy tractors and equipment levelling areas for winterized prefabricated huts and the widening of existing roads and building new roads to command posts overlooking the narrow river.

Meanwhile, IDF troops were reported to be continuing their occupation of the Phalangist headquarters in Falous, east of Sidon, from which the Christian forces had been ousted earlier. Reports from Beirut that the IDF has returned the base to the Phalangists were denied by the IDF. Israeli forces took over the base because the Phalangists had refused to cooperate with the IDF in halting their attacks against nearby Moslem and Druze villages. Despite the takeover, relations between the Phalangists and the IDF are said to remain amicable.
