## Israeli Students Receive HIAS Scholarships

Four of the HIAS scholarships are awarded through the Richard Alan Shapiro Memorial Fund, created by Edwin Shapiro in 1974, in memory of his son; four more are made possible through the Murray I. Gurfein Memorial Fund, established in 1980 to honor the late Judge Gurfein, who served as President of HIAS from 1956-57 and from 1960-67; one other award is given via the Harry and Kate Cohen Memorial Fund, created in 1979 by Ira Cohen, a long-time HIAS supporter, to honor his parents.

This year's Award recipients were: from Tel Aviv University, Menachem Aharon, Tamar Nahmias and Ofra Flesh; from Ben Gurion University, Mottie Goldberg, Allon Korav, and Dalia Mizrahi; from Hebrew University, Miriam Azoulay, Nila Delouya, and Dini Rahamin.

## Senator Chic Hecht Tours Nevada

A 17-day fact-finding tour of Nevada during most of August and early September has been mapped by United States Senator Chic Hecht (R-Nv.)

"Chat with Chic" meetings have been planned in 20 Nevada towns and cities in an effort to bring constituents up-to-date on national issues and to listen to concerns and problems of local people.

Once Congress adjourns for the summer, Senator Hecht will head for Nevada and the first in a series of meetings which will take him from Laughlin on the Colorado River north to Elko and from Lake Tahoe to Ely and Caliente.

The swing through Nevada communities is in fulfillment of a campaign promise to "keep in close touch" with Nevadans.

During his Nevada visit, Hecht will meet with constituents and county advisory boards, will hold town hall meetings, tour a Nevada gold mine, the naval air station at Fallon and the ammunition depot at Hawthorne.

"A number of my key legislative staffers in Washington, people who have for years worked at the national level, will be accompanying me on this trip through Nevada," Hecht said. "I want them to get to know Nevada better and conversely, they are the ones who can best answer questions from Nevadans on those issues and problems they have been working the past six months. I hope people in local areas will avail themselves of this opportunity to meet with me and my staff. Hopefully, we can together help solve some of their government-related problems."

NEW YORK (WNS) — A leading official of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai Brith has denunciation, that the Nations - sponsored

conference on "the Racist-Facist Alliance between South Africa and Israel" as another of the UN's "periodic exercises in hypocrisy and disinformation directed at Israel."

Abraham Foxman, the ADL's associate director, noted, in his denounciation, that the conclave in Vienna was supported by the UN Committee on Apartheid, using UN
