

Don't Miss Lecture On Sunday, February 26



John F. Rothmann is the third speaker in the Jewish Community Lecture Series, on Sunday, February 26, 1984, at 7:30 P.M., at Temple Beth Shalom, 1600 East Oakey Boulevard. Community-involved in-

dividuals and organizations have made the series available to the public at no charge.

Mr. Rothmann is a political and foreign policy consultant. For over a decade he has lectured on more than 100 college and university campuses from Harvard to Stanford and from U.C.-Berkeley to the University of Michigan on American Foreign Policy, Middle East and Soviet Policy, and the American Presidency. Richard Norton Smith, in his recently published biography of Thomas E. Dewey

(Simon & Schuster, 1982), described Rothmann as "a scholar of modern Republicanism."

Mr. Rothmann is president of the San Francisco District of the Zionist Organization of America, serves on the National Board of Trustees of the American Zionist Youth Foundation and was a delegate to the 30th World Zionist Congress held in Jerusalem in December 1982.

He received his Bachelor of Arts (1970) and Master of Arts

(1971) degrees from Whittier College, Whittier, California majoring in Political Science and Speech and Religion, and spent the summer quarter in 1968 at Hebrew University.

Mr. Rothmann has been honored in Outstanding Young Men of America Award (1973)

and Who's Who in California (1981); he is a member of Omicron Delta Kappa (Scholarship and Leadership Honor Society), Pi Sigma Alpha (Political Science Honor Society), Delta Sigma Rho-Tau Kappa Alpha (Speech and Forensic Honor Society), and the

National Forensic League.

His professional activities include working in the area of campaign consulting and foreign policy consulting; consultant to the American Zionist Youth Foundation and the Bureau of Jewish Education in Los Angeles; Director of Education at Whittier Beth Shalom and director of Richard M. Nixon Collection, Whittier, California College Library.

Mr. Rothmann is the co-author, co-editor and contributor to various publications.

In 1982, he delivered the Baccalaureate address at the U.S. Air Force Academy at Colorado Springs.

Mr. Rothmann's topic will be "The Ethnic Factor -- The Jew, Israel, American Politics and the 1984 Election."

Two Killed In Hotel Fire

TEL AVIV (WNS) — Two persons were killed and 11 were injured in a fire that swept through the top floors of a five story luxury hotel on the slopes of the Dead Sea. The two persons killed in the blaze were later identified as a 19-year-old soldier who was returning to his base from a weekend furlough and had stopped to help in the rescue of hotel guests, and the other as a 49-year-old chambermaid, who was trapped in flames on the top floor. Their names were not released.

The blaze broke out in the early morning hours sending some 15

persons to the roof to seek shelter from the fire. Army helicopters sent to rescue them gave up their efforts when it was found that the downdraft of the copters' rotors was only fanning the flames. The 15 persons were finally taken off the roof by cranes rushed up from the nearby Dead Sea potash works. The Tourism Ministry has appointed a commission to investigate the cause of the fire.
