

Avrushmi Is Formally Charged With Murder Of Grunzweig

JERUSALEM (WNS) — Yona Avrushmi, a 28-year-old resident of Jerusalem and the West Bank, was formally charged with the willful murder in the

grenade slaying of Peace Now activist Emil Grunzweig. The charge sheet, presented in Jerusalem District Court exactly one year after the

killing, alleges that Avrushmi purchased an Israel army issue hand grenade in January 1983, and on the night of February 10, 1983, positioned himself on a hill overlooking the Prime Minister's Office, and there awaited the arrival of a procession of Peace Now marchers who were scheduled to demonstrate outside the office.

At 8:50 p.m., as the demonstrators were about to disperse after singing the national anthem, Avrushmi

allegedly threw the grenade into the crowd, according to the charge sheet. The grenade exploded inflicting fatal wounds on Grunzweig, a 33-year-old teacher, who died within minutes. The charges state that the accused threw the grenade with intent to kill and fully understood the implications of his act.

scheduled March 7 - 13 for a worldwide mobilization for Soviet Jewry.

The Jewish leaders who arrived here included 22 presidents of national Jewish organizations. Thirty-one of the organization's 37 groups are represented. They were welcomed at the airport by Harry Hurwitz, an advisor to Premier Yitzhak Shamir, and Moshe Gilboa, director for the Foreign Ministry's Division of World Jewish Affairs.

The four day visit

here by the American Jewish leaders included private background briefings on foreign affairs, including a briefing at the Knesset with the Foreign Affairs and Defense Committee. The delegation met with Labor Party leader Shimon Peres and Defense Minister Moshe Arens. They visited with President Chaim Herzog and concluded their visit with a dinner at the Knesset which was addressed by Shamir.
