1. Do not go inside the house. Wait outside the door

2. Never go out collecting alone or at night. Use the "Buddy System."

3. Tell someone what area you will be in and always give a second choice area.

Always walk on sidewalk or driveways; don't walk on grass or lawn.

5. When sidewalk isn't available, walk on the left shoulder of the street, road or highway facing oncoming traffic.

6. Always cross the street at a designated crosswalk when provided.

If you must cross a street that doesn't have a designated crosswalk, you must yield the right of way to oncoming traffic.

Don't loiter in street gutter between parked cars

9. Don't sit on the street curb with your feet sticking out into the street.

Don't accept candy or gifts from strangers.

11. Ignore remarks from strangers; don't answer back, keep moving.

12. Don't accept a ride with a stranger.

13. If asked directions, stay away from the car door. Give directions loudly and move away.

14. Report any bad behavior to your leader, parent or police.

15. Write down license numbers of any suspicious cars.

U.S. Men's Volleyball Team To Compete At Thomas & Mack

The Olympic-bound United State's Men's Volleyball Team will compete against three foreign teams in a two-day international tournament at the Thomas and Mack Center March 30-31, 1984.

The tournament was scheduled as a pre-view of the 1984 Summer Olympics volleyball competition in Los Angeles. The USA Team will play against the Japanese, Canadian and Czechoslovakian men's teams. The tournament will be broadcast live on Japanese television.

Arrangements for the tournament are being handled by Las Vegas Events, UNLV Athletic Development Office and the UNLV Alumni Association.

Pre-tournament passes will be available through the Alumni Association (739-3621), Chuck-E-Cheese Restaurants, local high school volleyball teams, the Clark County Recreation Department, All State Tours locations at most major strip hotels and the cashier cage at the Union Plaza.

All tournament proceeds will benefit the USA Men's Volleyball Team, UNLV Athletics and the UNLV Alumni Association Scholarship Fund.

The tax-deductible passes cost \$8 and are good for admission to both nights of the tournament. Tickets will be on sale at the door for \$5 each night.

The first 3,000 women in attendance on Friday, March 30, will be given free Tom Selleck posters. (Selleck is the Honorary Captain of the USA Men's Volleyball Team). All spectators on Saturday, March 31, will be eligible to win round-trip air fare and admission for two to the Olympic Volleyball Finals in Los Angeles (sponsored by Arco and Western Airlines).
