

Jewish Community Is Not Single Issue Bloc When Casting Ballots, AJCommittee Says

NEW YORK (WNS) — Upset over the ongoing political pandering between the Democratic Presidential hopefuls here over who is a stronger supporter of Israel, the American Jewish Committee held a press conference to urge candidates to understand that Jewish voters are not a single issue bloc and are in-

involved with a wide range of domestic and other foreign issues.

"Analyses of recent election figures should convince all those involved in the political process that Jewish voters do not make up a single issue bloc and they resent candidates who appeal to them solely on the matter of Israel and the United

States-Israel relationship," declared Howard Friedman, president of the AJCommittee. He cited data prepared for the news conference in a memorandum titled, "The Jewish vote — What It Is and What It Is Not," by Milton Himmelfarb, the AJCommittee's director of Information and Research Affairs.

There has been in recent days a highly publicized focus by the candidates on their respective positions regarding the proposal to move the U.S. Embassy in Israel from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem. Friedman said that there was "an increasing percentage" in the current nomination campaign that Jews are concerned only

about one issue "and that is the location of the American Embassy in Israel." He called this a

"caricature presentation rather than one rooted in an entire range of their traditional concerns."

54 Solons Urge IOC To Deny Any PLO Application To Olympic Games

WASHINGTON (WNS) — At the initiative of Rep. Mel Levine (D. Calif.), the International Olympic Committee (IOC) has been urged in a letter signed by 54 members of the House to reject any application by the Palestine Liberation Organization to participate in the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles.

Declaring that "recognition of the PLO" by the IOC "would be morally repugnant and inconsistent with the International Olympic Committee's charter," the letter, stated: "The PLO represents neither a geographical area nor the Palestinian people."

"We think that recognition of the PLO by the International

Olympic Committee would be unthinkable in light of the massacre of Israeli athletes in the 1972 Munich Games by an affiliate of the PLO," said the letter to IOC chairman Juan Antonio Samaranch. Eleven Israeli athletes were killed in the Munich terrorist attack carried out by the Black September faction of the PLO.

"To confer International Olympic Committee recognition on the PLO would signal to the athletes around the world that the IOC has forgiven the PLO for its terrorist attacks and for its cowardly and victorious attack only 12 years ago," the letter said.
