Happy Passover **Kislik Released from Compulsory Labor**

NEW YORK - According to information received by the National Conference on Soviet Jewry (NCSJ), Prisoner of Conscience Vladimir Kislik returned to his hometown of Kiev after being released. Waiting eleven years to join his wife Evgenia, and son Maksim, in Israel, he plans to renew his application to emigrate.

The NCSJ reported that the forty-nine yearold physicist served one year in a labor camp and two years "working for the national economy." He was arrested in March 1981 and sentenced in May to three years labor camp for malicious hooliganism." The sentence was

changed in 1982. Prior to his arrest, Kislik was active in promoting unofficial seminars on Jewish culture. Α mildmannered man, he was tried on the allegation of attacking a woman in the street. Aware that there were no witnesses to the supposed incident, the judge pronounced that they were "unnecessary because all the facts are known.'

The National Conference on Soviet Jewry is the central coordinating agency for policy and action in this country on behalf of more than two million Jews in the Soviet Union.
