Don't Forget Munich, 1972

The hope of the Palestine Liberation Organization that some people would learn to forgive and forget apparently does not apply to the International Olympic Committee. The PLO was rumored to be seeking to participate in the 1984 summer Olympic Games in Los Angeles. But before the rumor was able to spread, the president of the Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee, Peter Ueberoth, said without any hesitation, that there would be no PLO team at the summer games.

But the mere thought of it shocked Rep. Mel Levine, the Democrat from California. He quickly gathered 53 of his colleagues to sign a letter to the

Internnational Olympic Committee saying that IOC recognition of the PLO would be "morally repugnant and inconsistent with the International Olympic Committee's charter."

"We think," the letter continued, "that recognition of the PLO by the International Olympic Committee would be unthinkable in light of the massacre of Israeli athletes in the 1972 Munich games by an affilliate of the PLO."

Indeed the prospect of such international recognition being bestowed upon the PLO is revolting. The immediate response from Ueberoth and the letter from the Congressmen are thus both welcomed. It demonstrates that many have not forgotten the terrorist actions of the PLO or that of the Munich massacre in 1972.

BONN (WNS) - The consideration to the West Germany's Leo- builds the two Leopards Egyptian government submitted a has weapons shopping list to West Germany and would also like to manufacture German tanks in Egypt under a licensing agreement.

The official request was made by the Egyptian Defense Minister, Abu Ghazala at a meeting in Cairo with Bonn's Deputy Foreign Juergen Minister, Moelle-Moellemann. mann told reporters on his return that the government has not yet decided to approve the arms sales to Egypt. It is understood, however, that it is giving favorable

Egyptian requests. Cairo would like to latter purchase Gepart antiarmored aircraft vehicles, Roland antiaircraft systems, Marder cooperation with the armored troop-carriers and scores of electronic systems for military use.

They are also seeking license to assemble a new West German light tank, which they would call "fahd" (Leopard) at a plant near Cairo. The tank is not identical to


NEW YORK (WNS) - For the first time in nearly a decade, the rabbi of Moscow's main synagogue
