# Israel Opposes Sale Of Stingers To Saudis

## Hart And Jackson Criticize Israel's Selling Of Weapons To South Africa

WASH. (WNS) — Sen. Gary Hart (D. Col.) and the Rev. Jesse Jackson both criticized Israel's selling of arms to the apartheid regime of South Africa. Their comments were made in separate appearances in response to questions on a television call-in program from Newark, N.J. where both men were campaigning for the Democratic Presidential primary there.

"I don't believe that the Israelis ought to be exporting arms to South Africa," said Hart on the Public Broadcasting System program. "I certainly don't believe any arms

coming from this country to Israel, whether under grants or under sale, should make their way to South Africa."

Jackson, meanwhile, appearing on the program, denounced Israel's arms relationship with South Africa. He said, "As we subsidize Israel, they are in fact selling arms to South Africa and they (the South Africans) are using these arms to shut down and oppress Black people there." He added that South Africa "sells diamonds to Israel that are being sold (by Israel) all over the world."

Asked about the charges levelled by

## Shamir, Arens Voice Concern

JERUSALEM (WNS) — Premier Yitzhak Shamir voiced Israel's strong opposition to the United States decision to sell Saudi Arabia 400 Stinger shoulder fired anti-aircraft missiles to be used by the Saudis to protect their oilfields and shipping in the Persian Gulf where the Iran-Iraq war has escalated.

Shamir made his remarks to the Cabinet two days before the Reagan Administration formally
