

World Jewish Congress President Addresses Conference In Morocco



Beneath a photograph of Morocco's King Hassan II, Edgar M. Bronfman, president of the World Jewish Congress, addresses the historic conference of Moroccan Jewish Communities in Rabat. The meeting, held in mid-May, was notable for the presence of leading Jewish figures from Israel -- including Moroccan-born Knesset members led by Tami Party Leader Aharon Abu-hatzeira. In his address, Mr. Bronfman asked in part: "Here in Morocco under the humanitarian King Hassan II, Jew and Arab have set an example, for all the world to see, of living in peace together." Crown Prince Hassan attended the Conference's closing dinner. Mr. Bronfman was invited to return to Morocco to meet King Hassan and plans to do so shortly.

Washington Exhibit Celebrates Danish Jewry, Wartime Rescue

WASH. (WNS) — Three dates stand out in the history of the Jews of Denmark -- the founding of the Danish Jewish community 300 years ago, the establishment of its "new" synagogue 150

years ago, and 1943 when a secret rescue operation, carried out with the cooperation of most of Denmark's Christian citizens, transported more than 7,000 Danish Jews to safety in Sweden from the Nazis in a makeshift fleet of fishing boats.

These three events are commemorated at an exhibit opened at

the B'nai B'rith Kluznick Museum here titled "King and Citizens, The History of the Jews in Denmark, 1622-1983."

This exhibit, circulated by the Jewish Museum of New York under the auspices of the Jewish Theological Seminary

of America, will be on view in Washington until September 15. The portion of the exhibit devoted to the rescue of the Danish Jews will

remain on view until Oct. 15.

Throughout the exhibit, original artifacts, photographs, and audio tapes blend to portray the events of three centuries of Danish-Jewish life.

sideration in the Senate. He is believed to have been living in Paraguay since 1959 and held citizenship of that country. In 1979, under stiff international pressure, Paraguay revoked Mengele's citizenship.

But Tuvia Friedman, head of the Nazi War crimes documentation center in Haifa, told a press conference in Tel Aviv on June 13, that Mengele is not living in Uruguay but is making frequent visits to the United States where he has millions of dollars hidden away.
