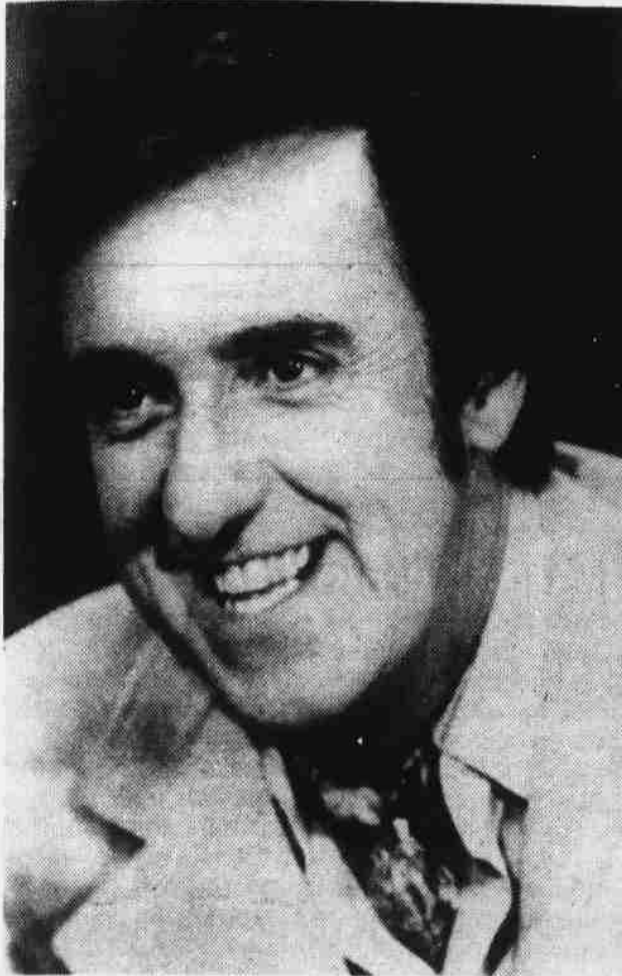


**Jim Nabors Stars In

NEW YORK (WNS) — Charlotte Jacobson, president of the Jewish National Fund, has become the only woman inducted this year into the Jewish Academy of Arts and Sciences. Before her election as JNF president, she had been chairman of the American Section of the World Zionist Organization and is a past Hadassah president.

Others among the 15 Jewish personalities receiving certificates as Fellows were David Gross, editor of the Jewish Week; Paul Safro, chairman of the Board of the B'nai Zion Foundation; former Congressman Herbert Tenzer, board chairman of Yeshiva University; and Roman Vishniac, the photographer.
