Mondale Would Move U.S. Embassy In Israel

Imminent Closure Of Israeli Office Near Beirut Is Expected

JERUSALEM (WNS) — Israeli officials are expecting momentarily formal notification from the Lebanese government that it is shutting down the "Liaison Commission," the quasi-diplomatic mission Israel has maintained at Dbaiyah, 10 miles north of Beirut, since shortly after its invasion of Lebanon in June, 1982.

The Commission was widely regarded as the forerunner of formal Israeli diplomatic representation in Lebanon, fortified by the withdrawal and security agreement signed by Lebanon and Israel on March 18, 1983. But

when President Amin Gemayel officially abrogated the pact last March, the Commission's legal status became uncertain as did its future.

According to reports from Beirut, the Lebanese government ordered the mission closed at a Cabinet meeting.

They said that while not surprised they were concerned over how Israel can maintain contacts with Lebanese officials in the future. Such contacts are important in the context of Israel's eventual withdrawal from south Lebanon, they said.

Reagan Opposed To Any Move

SAN FRANCISCO (WNS) — The Democratic Party apparently does not expect the Middle East to be a major issue in this year's Presidential campaign, although the party's candidates are expected to remind voters of the period when the Reagan Administration was castigating Israel.

This can be seen from the opening of the Democratic national convention and from the party's platform schedule adopted thereafter. New York Governor Mario Cuomo barely mentioned the Mideast in his keynote address which was largely devoted to domestic U.S. issues and the fear the President Reagan's policies could lead to a nuclear war.

Cuomo's one comment about Israel was, "We have been less than zealous in our support to our only real friend we have in the Middle East, the only

Appeal For Mengele



Holocaust survivor Marc Berkowitz (left), a twin who survived the experiments of Nazi "Angel of Death" Josef Mengele, urged that renewed pressure be brought to bear on Paraguay to locate Mengele and extradite him to West Germany. The appeal came at a New York press conference recently convened by the Los Angeles-based Simon Wiesenthal Center, headed by its Dean, Rabbi Marvin Hier (pictured above). Other participants included famed Nazi hunter Simon Wiesenthal and Rep. Stephen Solarz (D. N.Y.). In an emotional statement, the 52-year-old Berkowitz called Mengele, the 73-year-old Auschwitz doctor, "the greatest criminal of all-time" and added that "those few children who survived (estimated to be more than 180) have never been able to physically or emotionally recover from their ordeal."
