
Musical Entertainment For Seniors At Temple Beth Sholom

Hussein, Mitterrand Say Mutual Concessions Needed For Mideast Peace

PARIS (WNS) President Francois Mitterrand and King Hussein of Jordan said that peace can be obtained if all participants in the Middle East conflict would agree to make mutual concessions.

Hussein called for the staging of an international peace conference on the basis of United Nations Security Council Resolution 242 but the French President maintained a low profile on this issue and refrained from taking sides

Mitterrand, who concluded a two-day visit to

Jordan July 11, has been trying throughout his stay in Amman to avoid giving Israel cause for concern and has stuck to his policy of maintaining good relations with both and the Arab Israel states.

He spoke about Palestinian rights and the need for a Palestinhomeland refused to meet PLO chairman Yasir Arafat who was in Amman til Mitterrand's arrival, Mitterrand also refrained from calling for a PLO participation in future talks as the Palestinian representa-

Mitterrand at a press conference July 10 in Amman said the PLO must recognize Israel, as UN resolutions demand, before it can take part in any peace negotiations or hope to win international recognition.

Mitterrand scheduled to make a technical stopover in Cairo July 11 where he would confer with Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak.
