"No sooner out of jail, than the whole thing would start again," she says with a lauch. "This went on for quite a while and in the end the Can-Can dancers went before the high court judge in Paris and pleaded to do the dance without getting arrested

"The judge eventually ruled that the Can-Can would be allowed if the girls wore underwear. This was agreed to, and as far as I know, no Can-Can dancer has been arrested since - well, at least not for doing the Can-Can!"

### Leo Frisch, Editor And Publisher Of American Jewish World, Dead At 94

MINNEAPOLIS (WNS) who served as editor and publisher of American Jewish World, the local weekly, from 1912 to 1972, died recently at the age of 94 of natural causes, according to Robert Krishef, general editor and manager of the weekly. Services were held at Adath Yeshurun Congregation, a Conservative synagogue to which Frisch belonged.

Frisch was brought to Leo Frisch, a pioneer the United States from of Jewish journalism Lithuania when he was 11. He was born in Suvalki, Poland, in 1890. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Minnesota in 1912, beginning his newspaper career the same year.

> Frisch was a member of the board of directors the Jewish Telegraphic Agency for many years during the 1940's and 1950's. He had been a member of the Minnesota Newspaper Association and of the Minnesota Press Club. He had been a life board member of the Talmud Torah of Minneapolis and an executive board member of the Minneapolis Federation for Jewish Service.

Frisch also had been a member of the American Jewish Congress and the American Jewish Committee and has been honored, in 1982, for 70 years of service to B'nai B'rith. He had been a vice president of American Jewish Press Association for several vears.
