

### Entries Surpass 100 Mark For Third Annual Antique Auto Run At Imperial Palace

Entries for the Third Annual Antique Auto Run at the Imperial Palace recently surpassed the 100 mark and hotel officials estimate that as many as 300 cars may leave the starting line at this year's event, set for October 27.

"Although the Auto Run is still three months away, we have already exceeded the number of participants in last year's event," says Kris Engelstad, auto run coordinator. "We are receiving entries from across the country every day and, as a result of the tremendous response, are setting a limit of 300 automobiles."

The annual run, which begins and ends in front of the Imperial Palace, is limited to cars built before 1936. Drivers will follow a scenic route through the desert and mountains surrounding Las Vegas and are encouraged to dress in turn-of-the-century attire, stressing this year's theme, "An Ol' Fashioned Good Time." An outdoor catered lunch, open to the public, will be served midway through the run.

A 1931 Ford Model A, owned by Norman Wilmot of Lakewood, Colo., is the 100th car to be entered in this year's run, according to Engelstad. The oldest entry so far is a 1908 White Steam Car belonging to L.O. "Weed" Underwood of Burseson, Texas.

### Actor Theodore Bikel To Be Honored By B'nai B'rith At Convention

WASHINGTON -- Actor Theodore Bikel, who has been involved in the theater since the age of 19 and active in the labor movement, human rights and the Jewish community for nearly as long, will be honored by B'nai B'rith International during its biennial convention in September.

Bikel will receive B'nai B'rith's Generation Award for "outstanding achievements in the service of humanity, which uplift and ennoble us and generations to come."

The award will be presented on Sept. 4 at

the Sheraton Washington Hotel here.

Bikel, who calls himself a universalist, says he derives his general standard of humanity "from a particularist experience. Above all and before all else, I am a Jew," he says. "That, to me, means a heightened awareness of the human condition...a mode of living and a method of survival..."

The actor and singer has been a leader in the American Jewish Congress for more than 20 years. He is a founding member of AJC's Arts Chapter, past national vice president,

past co-chairman of its governing council and today is a senior vice president. He is also a member of the board of Amnesty International.

A longtime activist in the labor movement, Bikel is a vice president of the International Federation of Actors, a past president of the Actors Equity Association, and a member of the Academy of TV Arts and Sciences, the American Federation of Musicians, and AFTRA Screen Actors Guild.

In 1977, President Carter appointed him to a five-year term on the

Bikel was born in Vienna but moved to Israel (then Palestine) at the age of 13. He joined the Habimah Theatre when he was 19 and a year later became a co-founder of the Israel Chamber Theatre. He attended the University of London and graduated from the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London.

Bikel has appeared in dozens of plays, including A Streetcar Named Desire, under the direction of Sir Laurence Olivier; and The Love of Four Colonels, with Peter
