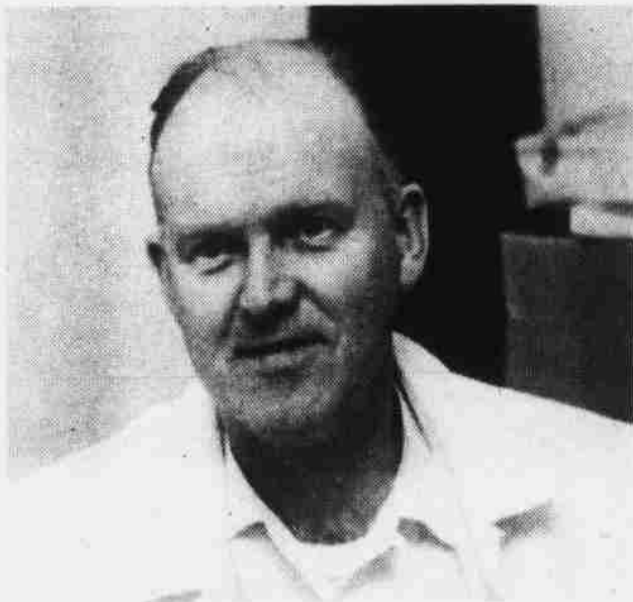


Political Hopefuls

**Mr. Gail D. Armstrong Files
For Assembly District 36**



Mr. Armstrong, in a prepared release, indicates that economic development and a solid tax base are the two issues he will be working toward. Armstrong, a Democrat, serves as the Governor's appointee on the I.A.F. Board, he is a member of the Rural Health Consortium, and he is State Director of Lincoln County Chapter of Retired Public Employees.

A member of the Nevada Association of Accountants, Mr. Armstrong served as City Councilman of Henderson, and was a member of the Clark County Fair and Recreation Board, 1949 to 1953.

"As a Las Vegas resident for 12 years, I've seen the dramatic growth our state has made. Now is the time to determine a solid course of planned growth for Nevada, so that the transportation, housing, industrial and other needs of our state are determined and prepared for in advance. We must ready ourselves now to ensure smooth growth through the 1980's and beyond."

"It is unfortunate that our society as a whole tends to categorize all of the elderly into one age group, when the only thing many of these people have in common is their age. With this thought in mind, our elected officials can come closer to the citizens of Nevada."

"There is little question that the subject of taxes was the dominant subject during the 1983 legislature. Obviously, taxes will continue to be a source of controversy in Carson City. It is essential that Nevada's elected officials utilize the input of their constituents to guarantee a fair and equitable tax structure that will be representative of the people's wishes and will meet our state's demanding budget requirements."

Our elected officials must continue to actively seek new and effective methods of funding and quality control for our school system."
