## Crosby, Stills And Nash Headline Outdoor Concert At Caesars Palace September 7

Crosby, Stills and Nash will headline the sixth Concert Under the Stars at Caesars Palace September 7 at 9 p.m.

First popular in the late 1960's, Crosby, Stills and Nash won its early acclaim with a combination of gentle melodies, intricate harmonies and a stirring social consciousness. In those years songs like "Teach Your Children," "Marrakesh Express" and "Suite: Judy Blue Eyes" reflected a society confronted with youthful rebellion striving to fulfill its idealism.

David Crosby, Stephen Stills and Graham Nash agreed at the outset that they would work together or alone, sometimes as a duo and sometimes with other people. And so their 16-year career has progressed with individual and group suc-

cesses. With Neil Young they completed a 1970 LP Deja Vu, later named "Album of the Year." Recording successes in the '70's continue with albums So Far (another collection with Young) and CSN.

In 1982 Daylight Again went platinum for the trio. A live LP, Allies, and a "best of" collection, Replay, have also done well.

Stephen Stills' newest album Right By You (Atlantic) includes a popular single "The Stranger," co-written by his son Christopher. Graham Nash is finding time between the trio's concerts to do a soon-to-be-released EP (extended play, or mini-album) Vote. And Crosby has just completed a solo tour.

At Caesars Palace the group will likely attract fans from age 14 to 40 - some who might have
