

West Germany Will Seek Extradition Of Brunner From Damascus

BONN (WNS) — West Germany will seek the extradition of Alois Brunner, a former top aide of Adolf Eichmann, now living in Damascus, to stand trial for sending thousands of Jews to Auschwitz and other death camps.

A Cologne court has issued a warrant for Brunner's arrest and the Foreign Ministry will submit an extradition request to the Syrian authorities shortly, according to a report in Der Spiegel. Political observers here see little chance, however, that the Syrians will extradite Brunner, now 72, who is running an apparently successful business in Damascus.

German authorities initiated proceedings against Brunner 20 years ago but abandoned them for lack of evidence. The new warrant is believed to be based on fresh material and documents attesting to Brunner's involvement

in the persecution of Jews in Nazi-occupied France during World War II.

He was chief of the notorious Drancy internment camp near Paris from which many French Jews were deported to Auschwitz. He also directed a special commando unit assigned the mission of arresting Jews in the French town of Nice and bringing them to Drancy. The bill of particulars drawn up by the Cologne court says that Brunner paid large sums to French Nazi collaborators for every Jew they arrested.

Brunner was close to Eichmann. The latter was said to have been his partner in the Damascus-based business known as the Khatar Office, while he lived in Argentina after the war. Brunner is said to be heavily involved in commerce in the Arab world.

Reagan's Mideast Peace Plan Is Reaffirmed By U.S.

WASHINGTON (WNS) — The State Department marked the second anniversary of President Reagan's September 1, 1982 Middle East peace initiative by stressing that the Administration still con-

siders Reagan's proposals the most "valid" means of achieving peace between Israel and its Arab neighbors.

Department spokesman John Hughes, declaring that the pro-

posals in the initiative "remain as valid today as when they were presented," rejected as "unfair" charges that the Administration has not been pursuing it in recent months.

He said at a press briefing that while there have been many "obstacles," such as the upheaval in Lebanon, the Administration has had a continuing "major diplomatic effort" in the Middle East. However, Hughes stressed, that does not mean that any "imminent breakthrough" is expected.

"That does not alter the fact the peace is worth pursuing; that nobody else has come up with any other kind of alternative that seems to make a great deal of

sense," Hughes said. He rejected the Soviet Union's proposal for an international conference on the Mideast as not a particularly helpful or constructive approach.
