

One of the great gentlemen of showbiz -- there aren't too many left - exited this mortal coil last Friday. IRVING FELD, who with son KENNETH was very much an adventurer in our town, still with two shows bearing the FELD imprimatur, "Beyond Belief" at the Frontier and "One Of A Kind" at the Desert Inn. He died in Venice, Florida, and ironically it was during a very human gesture that he collapsed of a cerebral hemorrhage. He had gone to Florida to deliver the eulogy for Mickey Antalek, an employee of Ringling Bros. & Barnum & Bailey Circus, another of the FELD's enterprises. Both SIEGFRIED & ROY, stars of "Beyond Belief" were overcome with grief. He was a father-figure to them. And BERNIE YUMAN, their personal manager, was in shock after hearing the news of IRVING FELD's sudden death. The two stars of the most popular show on the Las Vegas Strip eventually composed themselves as their shows went

nation's foremost producer of arena, ice and night club shows, started his long, hard climb with his brother ISRAEL as a snake oil salesman in carnivals and midways in traveling circuses. This early training launched the brothers into their own showbiz ventures, establishing rock n' roll revues and collections to tour arenas. IRVING became widely known for introducing some of the potential stars of those years, PAUL ANKA for instance, and earned a reputation of top rock producer in the U.S.A...Brother ISRAEL died in 1972 and KENNETH moved into the void building the FELD's reputation until it became the No. 1 producing team in the arena field.
