

23rd Semiannual Art Show At The Boulevard Mall

Fifty professional artists from 12 U.S. states are putting on a mammoth art show for eight days, Sunday, Sept. 16 through Sunday, Sept. 23, at The Boulevard Mall, Maryland Parkway at Desert Inn, in Las Vegas.

These artists will show about 2,000 pieces of their original works of art - oil paintings, graphics, metal-sculptured fountains, etchings, watercolors, bronze castings, pottery, stone sculptures, plus woodcarvings and Tapa art from Tonga.

Several of the artists will bring their paints, brushes, chisels and acetelyene torches and paint and sculpt during the show.

"I've just returned from Alaska," says Colorado artist Carole Bourdo. "I sketched and photographed both grizzly bears and mountainmen. I'll be painting these subjects during the Boulevard show. Stop by and visit with me and the other artists. We like to get your opinions on our





Show hours are: 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Friday; 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday; and noon to 5 p.m. Sundays.

Artists in the show will include: Gerry Feustel from Idaho painting watercolors in contemporary colors; Linda Neilson from Las Vegas showing decorative weavings; John Werling from California showing black and white photography (critics compare Werling's work with that of the late Ansel Adams); Terry Hutchison from South Dakota chiseling faces out of Ponderosa pine knots; Rich Irwin from California welding metal-sculptured fountains: Wallace Parker from Arizona painting portraits; Holly Merrifield from Colorado painting wildlife; Patrick John from Washington painting westerns: Sue Ratliff from Texas whose style takes up where the French impressionists left off; Lee Christy showing art from his Colorado gallery; George Lee from Utah painting seascapes; Argentine artist Henry Ramirez, now from Las Vegas, painting oils in the style of the Old Masters; and Trish Williams from Colorado showing Indian-type

KGB Harasses Moscow **Hebrew Teacher**


NEW YORK (WNS) -Soviet authorities are seeking to build the case against Moscow refusenik and Hebrew Aleksandr teacher Kholmiansky, according to information received from Moscow by the Greater New York Conference on Soviet Jewry. Following his arrest for a infraction of minor Soviet law, punishable only by fine, Kholmianbeing sky is now detained while the KGB attempts to gather evidence which will justify a major criminal charge.

These refuseniks have been instructed to supply written testimony to the fact that Kholmiansky distributed Jewish articles and teaching materials during his visits in Odessa. The Conference also reported that there were searches of five Moscow apartments in connection with the Kholmiansky case

within the last week.
