## Deadline Nears For Telephone Ownership

Central Telephone-Nevada customers are reminded they have only until September 30 to either purchase their leased telephones or return them to the company. Mandatory phone ownership will become effective on that date.

Since the phone ownership program began in February, more than 250,000 telephones have been purchased in-place. Purchasing the telephone will save customers a 60 cent per month lease charge for each telephone.

Customers who purchase their leased phones may select one of three payment options, said Nield Montgomery, Centel's business office manager.

They can pay in one payment, three equal installments (interest free) or finance their purchase through December 1985. Customers who do not return leased telephones by September 30 will be billed for them in October.

To facilitate a convenient transition into phone ownership, Centel-Nevada is offering in-place telephones at specially reduced prices.

Rotary dial phones will sell for \$11.95 each and any Touch-Call phone for \$22.95 each. A discount for persons over 62 years is available on the purchase of leased telephones.

For those customers who opt to return their leased telephones, Centel will open its Las Vegas offices on Saturdays, September 22 and 29, as a convenience. Each convenience center office will be open for leased telephone return only. Convenience Centers are located at: Boulder City, 503 Ash St.; Civic Center Plaza, 2121 Civic Center Drive; Henderson, 104 Water St.; Meadows, 330 S. Valley View; and Renaissance Center, 2340 E. Tropicana Avenue. No other business will be conducted on these special days.

## Terrorist Attack On U.S. Embassy In Beirut

TEL AVIV (WNS) — The Ramban Hospital in Haifa has offered its full facilities to treat the injured in the car bombing at the U.S. Embassy in Beirut and is standing by to receive casualties.

Defense Minister Yitzhak Rabin telephoned U.S. Ambassador Samuel Lewis to express his regrets at the incident and offer Israel's medical assistance as required.

U.S. sources said two Americans were killed. Reports from Beirut said 23 persons were killed and scores were wounded when a pickup truck loaded with explosives blew up just outside the Embassy grounds in

east Beirut. The American Ambassador, Reginald Bartholomew, reportedly injured by the blast, was treated in a local hospital.

Israel Defense Forces said that transportation difficulties may prevent the transfer of casualties to Israeli hospitals. There are no U.S. helicopters in the area and Israeli and Lebanese army helicopters were said to be unlikely to be

used. No explanation was given. Road transportation by ambulance also seems to be ruled out by various problems.

Meanwhile, south Lebanon was in a state of high tension after a unit of the Israel-supported South Lebanon Army (SLA) apparently ran amok in Sohmar village in the eastern sector, killing eight villagers and wounding more than 20, according to reports from the region.

IDF units and army ambulances were rushed to the scene to evacuate the wounded to local hospitals. The IDF is reported to have surrounded the village.

The SLA shooting was reportedly in retaliation for the ambush slaying of four SLA soldiers and the wounding of four others in the village. It could have adverse effects on Israeli plans to withdraw the IDF from south Lebanon, Jsrael has made clear that withdrawal would take place only when Israel's northern border was secure.

> New Speaker Of Knesset

JERUSALEM (WNS) — Shlomo Hillel, veteran Labor Knesset member, was elected Speaker of the 11th Knesset by a vote of 60-45. Likud's Meir Cohen-Avidor received only his own party's support and that of Shas and Kach. Tehiya and the Communist party abstained.

In his first address from the Speaker's seat, Hillel stressed the need to protect democracy from "marginal but strident threats within" and the need to preserve and enhance the dignity and prestige of the Knesset itself. He appealed in this respect "to educators and to the media."
