Israel-Lebanon Talks Resume

Ethiopian Jewry Issue Disrupts First Session Of CJF Assembly

The opening plenary of 30 minutes of uproar the 53rd General Assembly of the Council of Jewish Federations was totally disrupted here by demonstrators protesting on behalf of Ethiopian Jewry but the later was issue discussed at one of several forums. The opening plenary was to have featured a major policy statement by CJF President Martin Citrin but it was cancelled because of boisterous protest.

Over chants of "Let Simcha speak." to Simcha reference Jacobovici, producer and director of the awardwinning film "Falasha," cancelled

TORONTO (WNS) - session after more than which greeted 2,000 delegates arriving for the plenary.

Led by Jacobovici, a Toronto University student. the demonstrators marched in front of national network TV cameras. They carried placards demanding "Action Now" and pictures of starving Ethiopian Jewish children. many Falashas among the demonstrators included some women and children - one a tiny girl in Jacobovici's arms.

CJF President-elect Shoshana Cardin, first woman president of Baltimore's Associated Jewish Charities and

Sharp Differences Quickly Emerge

TEL AVIV (WNS) - After a brief suspension over Israeli arrests of four leaders of the Shiite Moslem militia, Amal, Lebanon returned to security talks at the bargaining table with Israel at Nakura and sharp differences surfaced immediately.

The Lebanese delegation to the military talks. held at the headquarters of the United Nations Interim Force for Lebanon (UNIFIL) and under UN auspices, promptly rejected Israel's proposal for deployment of the South Lebanese Army (SLA) to provide security just north of the Israeli-Lebanese border, even if the SLA was to be known as a brigade of the Lebanese regular army

Israel also had proposed that a beefed-up UNIFIL should be stationed north of the SLA area, up to the Awai River. The Lebanese said Lebanon does not recognize either the Christian-manned SLA, or its commander, Gen. Antoine Lehad. The Lebanese proposed to send a large Lebanese army to the border but agreed to the presence of UNIFIL troops near the Awali River.

A totally new proposal was made by the Lebanese, a demand that Israel pay \$8 billion to \$10 billion in war reparations for damages caused by the Israeli armed forces in fighting in Lebanon. The Israeli delegation dismissed the demand as a strategic ploy.

The Lebanese demanded release of the four Shiites and Israel responded that Amal had rejected a truce proposal and that it would not negotiate while the Amal continued its attacks. But, recently,

Dance music will be provided by Lenny LaVett. Greenspun and Mack further reported that the


