Sharing is a way of life for a unique group of Las Vegas families. The Candlelighters of Clark County share love, hope, knowledge, emotional support and a common experience; they all have a child with cancer.

According to Candlelighter's president, Linda Dale, "Cancer can destroy or redirect lives. We attempt not only to preserve life through treatments but to enrich the quality of life through emotional support and education. We help families deal with the new and sometimes frightening experiences they will encounter."

Since Nevada has no treatment center specializing in childhood cancer, most of the children must travel to out of state facilities regularly. The Candlelighters provide funds for transportation to and from the various centers and help make it possible for a parent to stay with the child during treatment.

Educating and informing parents is another service of the Candlelighters. Sunrise-Humana Hospital donates a room where they can hold their monthly meetings and house their ever growing library. The books and other printed materials are available to promote knowledge of the different types of cancer, treatments available and possible side effects.

The stress caused by having a child with cancer is all-consuming; the focus of the entire family shifts to the ailing child. In times of crisis,
