

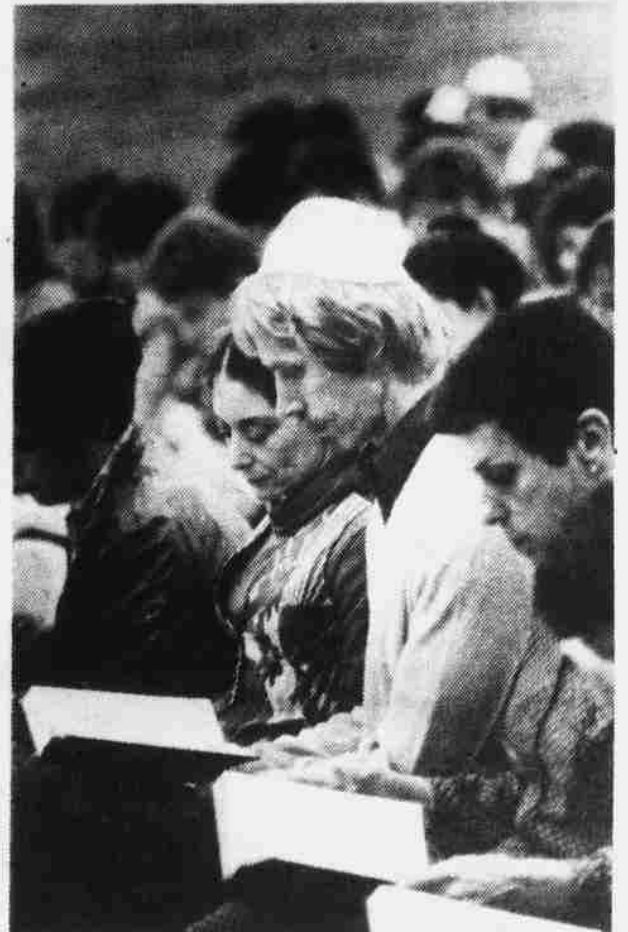
Ner Tamid Temple Youth Hosted 1984 Fall Conclave

NTTY (Ner Tamid Temple Youth) hosted the 1984 Fall Conclave for the South Western Federation of Temple Youth (SWFTY) over the Thanksgiving weekend. The theme of the conclave was "And Justice for All..." showing all aspects of justice and the law. One of the programs was a mock trial involving members of NTTY, a judge and the two public defenders.

Alan Hirsh was the defendant; Sheri Priess, Alex Harris, Melissa Glorinsky, Daren Tipe, Mava Siegel were witnesses. The judge was U.S. Magistrate Phil Pro and the two attorneys were Gary Lieberman and Karen Brasier.

The trial was enacted at a courtroom in the Federal Building. Alan Hirsh was accused of robbing a 7-11 late one night and members of the NTTY were the witnesses. Gary Lieberman was the prosecutor and Karen Brasier was the Defense. After the trial, members of SWFTY were divided into jurors where they deliberated on a verdict. Alan Hirsh was found innocent. On Friday night, NTTY put on a creative service with the subject of the service being justice. Saturday, a juvenile court judge spoke on the history of children's rights and what rights juveniles have.

For the Saturday night social, SWFTY wholeheartedly played games or Whirlyball until 11:30 P.M.

Mitch Warren, president of NTTY (North American Federation of Temple Youth) attended and said he was very impressed with the conclave. His slide show of his recent trip to Poland was very informative. The slide show included various places in Old Warsaw and many death camps.
