Rothman has served as a consultant for adolescent programming at the Bureau of Jewish Education in Los Angeles, Director of education at Congregation Beth Shalom in Whittier, director of the Havurat Noar Program and the Halutz Program, and co-director of the Bureau of Jewish Education Ulpan in Israel.

#### **Boston U. Professor To Lecture** In Jewish History At University In Poland

BOSTON (WNS) — Prof. Hillel Levine, a Jewish historian on the faculty of Boston University, has been invited to lecture on Jewish history at the Jagiellonian University in Cracow during the current academic year, Boston University announced here.

Levine, who has accepted the invitation, will deliver a series of lectures entitled "The Sociology of Hope: Studies in Jewish History" in which he will assess the intellectual and social history of Polish Jewry against background Polish history. He is scheduled speak at the Pontifical Institute in Cracow on "The History of Jewish Rituals" and, during the

spring semester, will lecture at the Catholic University in Lubin and act as a consultant to the Jewish Museum in Cracow.

Levine, a Harvardeducated sociologist and historian, noted that for the first time since World War II, Polish universities have begun to acknowledge the subject of Jewish history. During his stay in Poland he will suggest ways in which Judaic studies can be integrated into different curricula in that country.


