The American ORT Federation is made up of American Jews committed to the task of ORT. operating a global network of 800 schools and training centers which provide quality vocational and technical education to some 116,000 students throughout the Jewish world, 80,000 in Israel alone. ORT was founded in Czarist Russia in 1880. Today, ORT schools teach over 100 courses ranging from welding and carpentry to computer technology and robotics.

Producer John Stuart, asked why he made a change in the show, said, "I like to keep the show fresh. It's not a static thing, the same show month after month. Instead we try new things, add special effects, add a new 'legend.' John Lennon, Hank Williams and John Wayne are some of the most popular acts with the audience, and none of them were in the show a year ago."

Legends has been at the Imperial Palace since May 5, 1983. In late November Stuart and the cast reached the milestone of their 1000th performance.

"I am continually contacted by talented performers," Stuart goes on, "artists who re-create some great movie or music legend. When I find
