Cabinet Approves Troop Withdrawal Plan From Lebanon

Shultz Welcomes Israeli Withdrawal Plans From Lebanon

JERUSALEM (WNS) — Secretary of State George Shultz, in a personal message to Premier Shimon Peres, welcomed the Cabinet's decision to withdraw the Israel Defense Force from south Lebanon. The message, in which Shultz expressed hope that the withdrawal would be accompanied by political agreements between Israel and Lebanon, explained to the American envoy the nature of the three-stage with-

drawal, the first stage of which is expected to be completed in five weeks. He stressed that the withdrawal will be gradual and will enable the orderly transfer of the territories evacuated by the IDF to the Lebanese authorities and to the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL), and continuation of the negotiations with the Lebanese government. Most of Shultz's message to Peres, it

JERUSALEM (WNS) — Following two days of intensive debate, the Cabinet voted 16-6 to approve a three stage withdrawal of the Israel Defense Force from south Lebanon.

The plan, proposed by Defense Minister Yitzhak Rabin and strongly supported by Premier Shimon Peres, is a unilateral measure in the absence of a military security and withdrawal agreement with Lebanon, although Israel and Lebanon are expected to continue their negotiations at Nakura for the time being.

In the first stage, to be completed within five weeks, the IDF will pull back from the Awali River

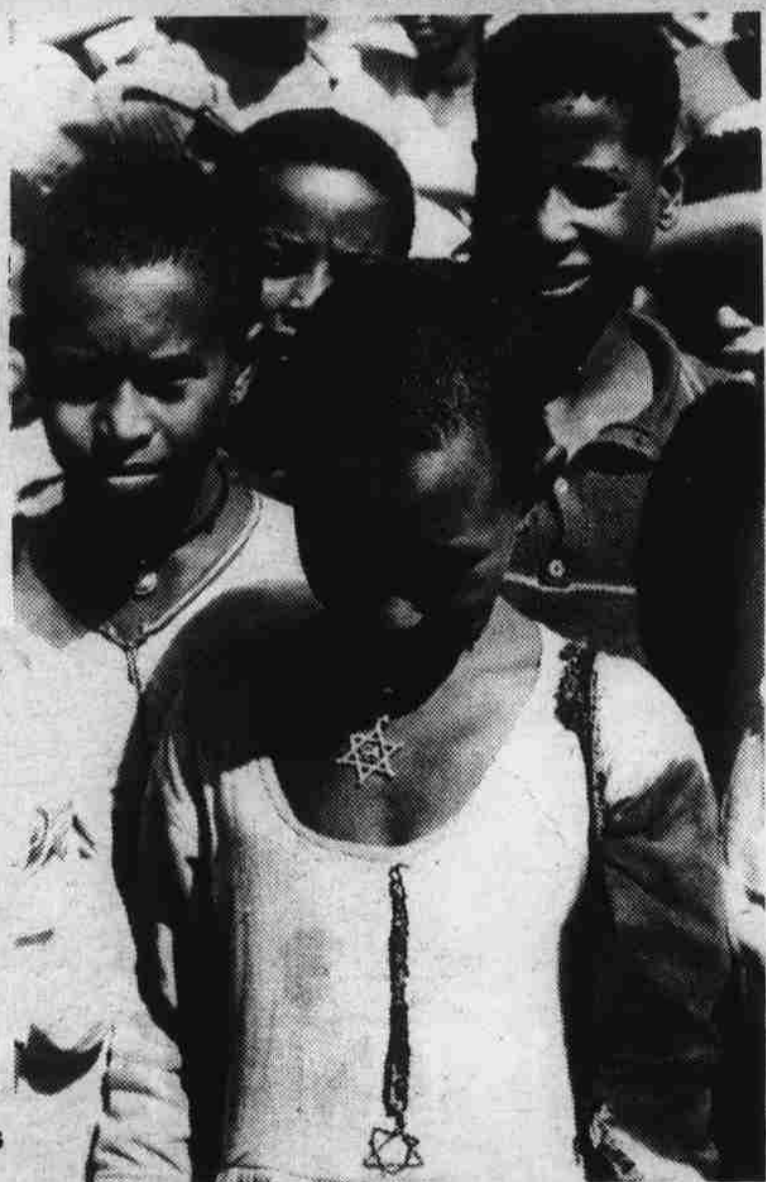
Hear Israel's Ambassador To The U.N. Friday Evening, January 25th, 8:00 P.M. At Temple Beth Sholom

The Honorable Benjamin Netanyahu, the Ambassador of the State of Israel to the United Nations, will address the Jewish Community of Las Vegas at Temple Beth Sholom on Friday evening, January 25th at 8:00 P.M., during the Friday night Sabbath services.

All the Jewish congregations of Las Vegas have been invited to attend and participate in this community-wide occasion. Conducting the Sabbath Services jointly will be the following: Dr. Louis M. Lederman, Rabbi of Temple Beth Sholom; Rabbi Edward Maline, Rabbi of Congregation Ner Tamid; Rabbi Mel Hecht, Rabbi of Temple Beth Am. Congregations Emanuel and Shaarei Tefilla have also been invited to attend.

This will be the first religious service in Las Vegas involving all the Jewish congregations and their spiritual leaders. It will also be the first time that the memberships of all Jewish congregations in Las Vegas have joined together for one community-wide Sabbath service.
