

Hadassah President Greet Israel's First

"Ultrasound Test Tube Baby"



Jerusalem...Ruth Popkin, National President of Hadassah, greets newborn Noa Shteiner, Israel's first "ultrasound test tube baby" as the happy mother, Dalia, performs the introductions. Noa developed from an egg aspirated from his mother's ovaries by doctors at the Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical Center here and fertilized in vitro. Physicians utilized ultrasound waves to guide them during the aspiration procedure and to implant the fertilized egg in the mother's uterus. Mrs. Shteiner and her husband, Zvi, a captain in the Israel Defense Forces, had been trying for 10 years to become parents.

U.S. Aided Ethiopian Rescue, But Refuses To Give Details

WASHINGTON (WNS) — The State Department has confirmed that the United States has been assisting Ethiopian Jews to emigrate to Israel, but refused to give any details.

Department deputy spokesman Alan Romberg read a carefully worded statement after being asked about the announcement in Israel that some 10,000 Ethiopian Jews have been airlifted to Israel recently:

"The United States is deeply concerned about the plight of African refugees, including African Jews, who have been affected by conflict, oppression, famine in the region. The U.S. has taken a direct and special interest in their well-being and we are continuing to work with international organizations, voluntary agencies and the governments of concerned countries to provide food, medical care and resettlement opportunities for refugees.

The U.S. has been working quietly and closely with a number of organizations and governments to save the lives of African refugees, including African Jewish refugees."

Romberg said he would not "get into the detail of what we have done and how we have done it."

was learned, was devoted to Israel's economy. Secretary of State welcomed the economic measures the Israel government has taken so far but made it clear that the Reagan Administration is waiting for more drastic measures that would lead to a real im-

provement in the economy. Voice of Israel Radio reported that Lewis informed Peres that the Administration is ready to grant Israel \$1.8 billion in military aid. But there are still no signs of a positive American response to Israel's arequest for an additional \$750 million in economic aid.
