#### Purim -- A Time For Masquerading - March 7th

(WZPS) - Purim is a day for feasting, merrymaking and masquerading. It commemorates the triumph of Esther and Mordecai over Haman, the wicked chief minister of King Ahasuerus, who sought to destroy all the Jews of the Persian Empire. These events are related in the Book or Megillah of Esther which is read every year on the eve and morning of the festi-

The story of Esther was only reluctantly included in the Biblical canon and from medieval times has emerged as a day when anything and everything goes...In fact the excesses of eating, drinking and frivolity are sanctioned by Halachah and centuries of Jewish tradition.

#### Masks and Costumes

Purim is a time when both children and adults masquerade in a variety of masks and costumes sometimes in imitation of the characters of the Megillah. An old print from Holland shows us that three hundred years ago people would masquerade as kitchen utensils.

From the Middle Ages people in some communities would disguise themselves in various costumes and masks and wander through the streets visiting homes singing and playing and making people laugh. A Moritz Oppenheim oil painting, 'Purim at Home', shows strolling masked Purim-shpilers entertaining a family. Even in Orthodox communities the taboo on acting and the use of masks was lifted on Purim.
