An all-new 136-page travel guide has been published by the American Jewish Congress, ushering in the organization's 1985 tour program.

Inaugurated 27 years ago, the AJCongress International Travel Program features tours to Israel, as well as to 30 other countries in Western and Eastern Europe, the Orient, South Seas, Egypt and China. All "Congress" tours include a unique blend of general sightseeing, touring, of Jewish interest, cultural events, meetings and briefings with the Jews of the various lands visited. Since 1958, more than 325,000 travelers have participated in the organization's tours. The American Jewish Congress, founded in 1917, is dedicated to human rights and the eradication of all forms of prejudice, discrimination and anti-Semitism.

Membership in AJCongress is required in order to participate in the travel program.

The American Jewish Congress is also holding Travel Presentations for the public in New York, Boston, Philadelphia, Washington,

D.C., Alexandria, Va., and Long Island. The AJCongress Travel Presentations are free of charge and feature a premiere screening of the organization's new travelogue: "A World of Difference." There are also door-prizes, refreshments and an opportunity to talk with "Congress" travel staff about the 1985 tour program.

New destinations for 1985 include "The Emerald Isle (Ireland) and England," Korea, the Philippines and Australia; a "Mediterranean Odyssey" by ship to Italy, France, Yugoslavia and Greece. New Israel offerings include a tour "Just For Women" and "Jerusalem: A Perfect Week." AJCongress also specializes in tours for Singles: in 1985 there will be a "singles tour" to Israel, Ireland and England, and to Morocco and Spain.

PARIS (WNS) — A "Refusenik Street" was formally inaugurated in the Paris suburb of Sarcelles. Israel Satisfied With Reagan-Fahd Talks

the Egyptian-Israeli peace treaty. He noted that the USSR has refused to have diplomatic relations with Israel and pointed to the current anti-Semitic campaign against Soviet Jews.

Murphy stressed that the meetings in Vienna will be discussions, not negotiations. He also assured Rosenne that the U.S., like Israel, continues to oppose the Soviet Union's call for an international conference on the Middle East.

This position was stressed by State Department spokesman Bernard Kalb. He said the meeting in Vienna would be "an exchange of views" between the U.S. and the Soviet Union on "Middle East regional issues. The talks will not constitute negotiations nor are they intended to lead to broader negotiations," he said.

Meanwhile, it was still unclear here as to whether the agreements in Amman between King Hussein of Jordan and chief Yasir Arafat for a framework for common action would lead to negotiations with Israel. Reagan, leaving the White House for a brief vacation in California, told reporters that "it seems as if some progress has been made," adding, "we're being optimistic about it."
