


WASHINGTON (WNS) - The United States wants Israel to participate in programs providing aid to Third World countries, especially in Africa. according to Kenneth Bialkin, chairman of the Presidents Conference. M. Peter McPherson, administrator of the Agency for International Development (AID) stressed this week during a briefing by Reagan Administration officials with some 100 Jewish leaders last week and encouraged Israel to bid on various AID projects.

JERUSALEM (WNS) - Hundreds of Jewisn youths are expected to come to Israel this summer via the same route taken by illegal immigrants 40 years ago. They will reconstruct the voyage of Maapilim (illegal immigrants') ship, en route to the First World Conference of the Young Guard for Zionist Renaissance, to take place in Jerusalem.

TEL AVIV (WNS) — The cornerstone of the International ORT Braude Institute of Technology. the first of five ORT sponsored technological education centers in Galilee, was laid in Carmiel on February 4. The ceremonies were part of a festive gathering of World ORT Union, attended by delegates from 40 countries who were addressed by Premier Shimon Peres, who praised ORT's expansion of its educational network in Israel.



WASHINGTON (WNS) - The U.S. Education Department sent an apology to the American Jewish Congress for the distribution of a speech deploring the Godlessness in the once "Christian" United States. The Department's regional representative in Denver, had mailed the 12-page speech to Christian educators in his sixstate region last December.

PHILADELPHIA, PA. -- While world leaders will be marking the 40th Anniversary of the victory of their allied armies over Nazism, American Jewish Survivors of the Holocaust and their families will meet here, April 21-22 to evaluate the positive effects of the moral dimension of that victory. Thousands of Holocaust survivors are expected to attend and participate in the Inaugural Assembly of the American Gathering of Jewish Hoiocaust Survivors at the Civic Center, an event which will coincide with the 40th Anniversary of World War II and the liberation of the Nazi death camps.

CHICAGO (WNS) - The first National Seminar in Israel for Young Artists will take place this summer, providing qualified Jewish teenagers with an opportunity to experience Jewish culture in Israel as a source for creative expression. The new program has been developed by the Chicago Board of Jewish Education, a beneficiary of the Jewish Federation, in cooperation with the American Zionist Youth Foundation.
