Davis' show business career began at the age of 4, singing and dancing with his father and uncle as part of the Will Mastin Trio. The Trio started in low-paying nightclubs and eventually built an enthusiastic following after a cross-country tour.

But it wasn't until one night in 1946 at Ciro's in Los Angeles that the Will Mastin Trio Featuring Sammy Davis, Jr. moved into the national limelight.

It was Academy Awards night with the Trio opening for Janis Paige. The biggest names in the business, Martin and Lewis topped the list. had come to Ciro's after the Oscars were handed

The Trio gave their best performance, and their reward was eight bows (Paige's contract stated the opening act could only have two bows). The audience and the critics loved them.

The following night the Will Mastin Trio received equal billing, and Janis Paige opened for them. The Will Mastin Trio Featuring Sammy Davis, Jr. was on its way.

Davis continued as a solo performer after his father and uncle retired. He went on to record more than 40 albums and sell more than 15 million singles, including Gold Records for "Candy Man," "I Gotta Be Me," "What Kind Of Fool Am I?" and "Baretta." Davis has also appeared in nine feature films and was the first black celebrity to have his own television variety show.
