Reid Questions Department Of Defense "Public Relations" **Expenditures**

WASHINGTON - Challenging the current Department of Defense custom of paying \$140-\$500 million annually for the "public relations" costs of defense contractors, Rep. Harry Reid is co-sponsoring legislation introduced today to eliminate these wasteful practices.

These costs include such items as foreign travel, corporate parties, glossy advertising, Hollywood-style promotion films and plastic models of military equipment. "My bill will eliminate the tax deduction for defense contractor public relations costs," Reid said, "as these expenses are neither 'ordinary' nor 'necessary' to the business of a strong national defense."

Reid said it is outrageous for the public to bear these costs, considering the tremendous deficit problem and the pressures to reduce spending and increase revenue. "Can we really justify continuing to allow defense contractors both to charge the taxpayer for elaborate parties and plastic toys ... " Reid asked, "and then to write those costs off their taxes?"

For more than 20 years, the Pentagon has allowed contractors to bill the American public for so-called public relations expenses, which add to the cost of weapon systems and to the Pentagon budget. Reid added, "and, I'm going to do what I can to stop this irreverent practice.'

12th Maccabiah Games To Open July 15

TEL AVIV (WNMS) -More than 4,000 Jewish athletes will compete in 30 different sports at the 12th Maccabiah Games due to open at the Ramat Gan stadium on July 15, according to an announcement by the International Committee for the Maccabi Games.

Some 3,400 of the record 4,200 participants will be coming from abroad, one-third of them from Latin America. The U.S. contingent is expected to number 550, up from 372 at the last games; and Australia, up from 193 to about 300. New entries this year will be
