Hope-Burns Eternal For Hall Of Fame At Gala Las Vegas Dinner April 13

LAS VEGAS, NV. - A gala "Founders Day" fund-raising dinner, featuring Bob Hope and George Burns, to benefit the newly-formed International Boxing Hall of Fame (IBHF), in Las Vegas, will be held on Saturday, April 13, at the Riviera Hotel, it was announced by Ron Schaefer, Chairman of the IBHF.

The IBHF is a \$30 million complex dedicated to the international sport of boxing that will be located on the Las Vegas "Strip," and is expected to open in mid-1987. The unique structure, which includes nine satellite facilities plus an impressive central rotunda, will be the most ambitious Hall of Fame built to date. Unlike existing Halls of Fame, the IBHF will provide a number of programs for young people and members of the boxing community that reflect a long term commitment to the 3,000 year-old sport.

Called "The Main Event," the star-studded evening will also feature a number of former and current boxing champions in attendance. With the much-touted Thomas Hearns-Marvin Hagler fight scheduled two days later in Las Vegas, the dinner's principals expect the boxing world to provide an impressive turnout. Bronze founder's plaques, on the wall of the main IBHF rotunda, will feature individual names of those people in attendance at the April 13 dinner.

The program for "The Main Event" includes an elegant reception, gourmet-style dinner, and an exciting entertainment finale. Along with Burns and Hope, singer Joey English, talented nightclub entertainer, and the Riviera Orchestra will also be featured.
