

Laughlin Gets First Radio Station



Laughlin, Nevada will soon have its first radio station, according to the station's President, Tom Letizia.

Laughlin Roughrider Broadcasting Corporation filed with the Federal Communications Commission nearly four years ago to broadcast on 870 AM. Due to competitive applications from both Arizona and California all three markets were required to solve any interference problems.

"We needed to show the FCC that all stations would be protected - even one in New Orleans," stated Letizia.

The new Laughlin station will be a 10,000 watt clear channel serving a wide coverage area in Nevada and Arizona. Plans are underway to construct 'state of the art' AM stereo equipment making the station one of the most modern in the nation. The format plans are leaning in the direction of Adult Contemporary music.

Roughrider Broadcasting principals include former Nevada Governor Michael O'Callaghan; Sig Rogich, member of President Reagan's "Tuesday Team;" and Tom Letizia, veteran radio broadcaster. Roughrider Broadcasting also owns KPAH radio in Tonopah which serves most of central Nevada.

The new station is expected to be on the air by September 1, 1985.

Dave Swan Is Court Jester At Imperial Palace

He learned show business in hundreds of workingmens' clubs and community centers in Great Britain. After several years of this, he progressed to the major night clubs and theatre clubs there.

Dave has opened for many of Britain's top stars as well as quite a few international stars including Tony Bennett, Billy Eckstine, Engelbert Humperdinck, Roger Whittaker and Matt Monro. He has also traveled throughout the world entertaining British and American servicemen and vacationers at popular resorts.

In 1972, he was invited to take part in a very special show called "A Salute to the Prince of Wales." This show was held in London at the Royal Albert Hall in the presence of His Royal Highness Prince Charles and an audience of ten thousand people.
