"Let it be clearly understood: there can be no reconciliation with the unspeakable horrors perpetrated by the SS. The SS were the chief agents of Hitler's war against the Jews; they manned the ramparts of the Holocaust kingdom. It is morally obscene for the President of the United States -- however well-meaning his intentions -to lay a wreath at a cemetery containing SS graves."

Two other AJC officials, Rabbi A. James Rudin, National Director of Religious Affairs, and Irving M. Levine, Director of National Affairs and Director of the AJC's Institute for American Pluralism, issued a joint statement:

"It is heartwarming that such a diverse group of American ethnic and religious leaders have declared themselves so emphatically as being opposed to President Reagan's Bitburg cemetery visit. It is an issue that has touched deep emotional chords among all sections of the American public whose memories of why we fought against Nazi brutality have not been extinguished by time. Their voices heard now will make it more difficult for their children to forget the Holocaust and its meaning to all mankind."

NEW YORK (WNS) - Mayor Edward Koch unveiled a street sign honoring Raoul Wallenberg, the Swedish diplomat who saved more than 100,000 Hungarian Jews during the Holocaust. Wallenberg was arrested by the Red Army when it liberated Budapest 40 years ago. The street sign designates the west side of First Avenue, across from the United Nations, from 42nd street to 49th street as "Raoul Wallenberg Walk."

Dear Michael:

In forcing the American people to swallow the bitter pill of Bitburg, President Reagan has shown that he is more interested in symbolically alleviating any resentment and anger remaining from World War II than with the needs and feelings of his own citizens. As leaders of American women's groups of different religions, races and creeds, we are deeply disturbed that the President has expressed his insensitivity in this manner.

The President now seems to think that he can silence American protests by also visiting the site of a former concentration camp -- rather in the manner of applying a band-aid to a serious wound. But his actions dishonor our national pride in those Allies who bravely fought against Facism, those who fell in the struggle, and our memories of the tragic deaths of the twelve million Jewish, Christian and other victims of the Holocaust.




