

Soviet Jewish Emigration **Tumbles To 51 During May**

NEW YORK (WNS) -Only 51 Jews were permitted to leave the Soviet Union in May, marking a sharp decline from the some 166 who were permited to leave during April, National Conference on Soviet Jewry (NCSJ) reported recently.

In April, among the 166 Jews permitted to leave were some 100 who were residents of Moscow, where no movement occurred in May. At that time, a premature euphoria developed in some areas of the Soviet Union, according to NCSJ chairman Morris Abram.

"Recent speculation, based upon rumors of a possible increase, was misleading to people who want to see real

UNLV will hold seven orientation sessions over the summer for newly admitted students who want to register for fall classes and become more familiar with the campus. The scheduled dates are June 20, July 10 and 23, and Aug. 6, 26, and 27.

Attendance at one of the orientation sessions is mandatory for new students who want to preregister, according to Rick Oshinski, UNLV's orientation director. Those who do not attend will have to go through regular registration Aug. 28 and 29.

Each orientation program will begin with an 8:30 a.m. check-in on the second floor of Moyer Student Union, followed by a slideshow and presentations on various campus services at 9 a.m. Students will then be taken on a guided tour of the campus. Afterward, they will be instructed on the registration process, Oshinski said.

Students will talk with academic advisors from their prospective colleges, and will then be allowed to complete their registration for the fall semester.

A tour of the library will also be included in the programs.

Oshinski said he expects at least 1,500 students to attend the sessions.
