The 25 are part of the 600 freed prisoners who remained in Israel or in the West Bank and Gaza after the ex-The Israel authorities claim they have no right to be here because theyu did not possess local identification cards prior to their arrests.

The authorities said it had been made clear prisoners those were they when released from jail that they could not remain in the country longer than 21 days.

Three of the freed who had terrorists returned to their homes in trhe West Bank, left for Jordan shortly after their return because of threats and harassment by Jewish settlers. The three had been serving time in connection with the murder of a Jewish settler from Tekoa.

Shmuel Goren, coordinator of government affairs in the territories, is trying to curb Jewish militants. He met June 3 with members of the Kiryat Arba town council to urge the settlers to maintain law and order.

Meanwhile the Council of Jewish Settlements in Judaea and Samaria called for action to induce the "responsible authorities" to deport Palestinian terrorists who were allowed to return to their homes in the territory following the May 20 prisoner exchange.

The decision of the representative body of Jewish settlers in the West Bank, by em-phasizing the term "resaponsible authorities" implied criticism of the tactics of threats and harassment resorted to by some settlers in recent days to force the freed terrorists to leave.

The resolution adopted by the Council said it would attempt to recruit the support of the Israeli public for the purpose of stressing the danger to all of having hundreds of convicted terrorists at large.
