Senior citizens who are looking for a way to maintain good health may want to check into the physical examination program at the Clark County Health District.

Anyone over the age of 60 is eligible for the free examination which is conducted by a nurse practitioner. The exam includes a comprehensive check of blood pressure, urine, blood test for anemia, glaucoma, hearing and vision problems. Pap smears are included for women and health counseling is included for all participants.

When health problems are detected, patients are referred to a physician for medical care.
