Future Women Rabbis Gather For Seminar

NEW YORK - Thirty women rabbinical students from three Jewish seminaries met recently to discuss some of the challenges and concerns they face.

The conference, held at The Jewish Theological Seminary of America, was attended by women from Hebrew Union College, which trains rabbis for the Reform Movement, The Reconstructionist Rabbinical College in Philadelphia, and The Jewish Theological Seminary, which trains Conservative rabbis.

According to Lori Forman, Jewish Theological Seminary rabbinical student and co-coordinator of the seminar, this is the first time that female students from all three seminaries have gathered to discuss their choice of entering the rabbinate. "Women see the importance of building bonds between each other and our movements. We are working to strengthen these bonds," Ms. Forman said.

A topic of concern was assuming the leadership role. Many women see functioning in their future rabbinical positions as resource people
